WOF = Width of Fabric


#### REQUIRED MATERIALS....

- 27" × 14" off white gray Xs for backgrounds, HST, block centers and strip piecing (Fabric A)
- $4" \times 7"$  green plaid for **HST** (**Fabric B**)
- $4" \times 7"$  red ditsy for **HST** (**Fabric C**)
- $4" \times 7"$  pink with scattered squares for **HST** (**Fabric D**)
- $4" \times 7"$  teal medallion grid for **HST** (**Fabric E**)
- 2½" × 14" blue floral stripe for **strip piecing** (**Fabric F**)
- 2½" × 14" pink lattice for **strip piecing** (**Fabric G**)
- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " × 14" orange hashtags for **strip piecing** (**Fabric H**)
- 2½" × 14" green floral stripe for **strip piecing** (**Fabric I**)
- $4" \times 14"$  taupe lattice for **sashing** (**Fabric J**)
- 7" × WOF charcoal solid for **binding** (**Fabric K**)
- 27" × 21" for **backing**
- various scraps for appliqué
- fusible webbing
- black embroidery floss


#### CUT FABRICS\_\_\_\_\_

From off white gray Xs (Fabric A), refer to diagram below to cut:

- (2) 5½" × 13" rectangles for appliqué backgrounds
- (8)  $3'' \times 3''$  squares for **HST**
- (4)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " ×  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares for **block centers**
- (1)  $1" \times 1"$  square for **cornerstone**
- (4)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × 14" strips for **strip piecing**

From green plaid (Fabric B), cut:

• (2)  $3" \times 3"$  squares for **HST** 

From red ditsy (Fabric C), cut:

• (2)  $3" \times 3"$  squares for **HST** 

From pink with scattered squares (Fabric D), cut:

• (2)  $3" \times 3"$  squares for **HST** 

From teal medallion grid (Fabric E), cut:

• (2)  $3'' \times 3''$  squares for **HST** 

From blue floral stripe (Fabric F), cut:

• (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × 14" for **strip-piecing** 

From pink lattice (**Fabric G**), cut:

• (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × 14" for **strip-piecing** 

From orange hashtag (Fabric H), cut:

• (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × 14" for strip-piecing

From green floral stripe (Fabric I), cut:

• (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " × 14" for strip-piecing

From taupe lattice (Fabric J), cut:

• (4)  $1'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$  rectangles for **sashing** 

From charcoal solid (Fabric K), cut:

• (2) 2½" × WOF for **binding** 

#### Half Square Triangles.

**STEP 1:** On the back of (1)  $3'' \times 3''$  A square, draw a line diagonally from corner to corner.

**STEP 2:** Layer this square and (1) B square, right sides together, making sure to line up the edges.


STEP 3: Sew 1/4" on both sides of the drawn line.


**STEP 4:** Cut on the drawn line. Press away from A.

**STEP 5:** You will now have two A/B units.

Repeat Steps 1-5 to make a total of (4) A/B HST, (4) A/C HST, (4) A/D HST, and (4) A/E HST.

**IMPORTANT:** Trim each HST to  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " ×  $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".


#### STRIP PIECING\_\_

Join (1) Fabric A strip with (1) Fabric F strip. Press away from A.

Cut strip set into (4) 2½" sections.

Repeat Steps 1 and 2 to make a total of (4) A/F units, (4) A/G units, (4) A/H units, and (4) A/I units.

Each unit should measure  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " ×  $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".















PIECED BLOCKS


Arrange units as shown. Sew together into rows. Press seams toward strip-pieced units.


Sew rows together. Press seams toward center row.

Each block should measure  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " ×  $6\frac{1}{2}$ ".











#### APPLIOUÉ\_

NOTE: Appliqué design is symmetrical, so there is no need for a reverse diagram when tracing shapes for fusible appliqué. Gently peel fusible paper from the back of each shape. Refer to Assembly Diagram to arrange shapes on background fabric.

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Appliqué in place using the method and stitch of your choice.



Appliqué - Make (2)


#### EMBROIDERY

Using the Assembly Diagram as a guide, draw embroidery lines with a temporary marking pen (such as a FriXion pen). With three strands of black embroidery floss, use a running stitch to create the bees' flight path. Use a back stitch to create bees' antennae, and add a French knot to the end of each antenna.



#### Assemble Table Runner\_\_\_\_\_

Arrange blocks as shown. Sew sashing strip between two blocks; press toward sashing. Sew sashing strips to each side of cornerstone; press toward sashing. Sew pieced blocks and sashing unit together; press toward sashing unit. Sew one appliqué unit to each end as shown; press toward pieced blocks.



#### FINISH TABLE RUNNER\_

Layer top, batting, and backing. Quilt as desired.

Piece binding into one long strip. Fold in half lengthwise, wrong sides together, and press. Line up raw edges of the binding with the raw edge of the table runner. Sew binding to the front side of the table runner, starting at any side. Turn the binding over and hand stitch to the back of the table runner.



All shapes are symmetrical; diagram can be used for tracing and for placement



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
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
