## Blue Onion Workshop Supply List

**Pattern:** You will need to purchase a copy of the *Blue Onion* quilt pattern by Karla Alexander of Saginaw St Quilt Co.

**Fabric:** See yardage requirements on pattern

**Ruler:** Ovals All Ways by Creative Grids (This ruler is a bit pricey, so feel free to share with another participant.)

### Basic Sewing Kit:

- Fabric shears
- Patchwork pins
- Thread snips
- Seam ripper
- Thread in a neutral shade to match your fabrics

### Rotary Cutting Supplies:

- Rotary cutter with fresh blade (45 mm works best)
- 10-1/2" or larger square ruler
- Cutting mat

### Additional Supplies:

- Spray starch or your favorite starch alternative
- Roxanne Glue-Baste-It (I prefer the 1 oz. EZ-Squeeze bottle with the fine tip applicator.)

### Optional Supplies:

- Rotating cutting mat big enough to accommodate a 10-1/2" square ruler
- Tailor's Awl
- At least two 15" mini design boards\*

**Sewing Machine, etc:**

- Sewing machine in working order
- 1/4" patchwork foot
- Sewing machine needles

Please cut your fabrics into 12-1/2" x 14" rectangles per the pattern instructions prior to the workshop.

\* I love using mini design boards to organize my blocks in process. These will allow you to easily transport your block pieces back home. I use foam core board from the dollar store (you'll be able to get two 15" boards out of each 20" x 30" board), cotton batting, and Aleene's Tacky Glue in place of a hot glue gun (why burn your fingers if you don't need to?!). I don't bother adding the binding trim, but feel free to do so if you wish. If you aren't familiar with how to make them, below is the link to Lori Holt's how-to tutorial
